## MID-TERM OBJECTIVES 2011 - 2014

- Financial Sustainability: Secure financial resources to support implementation of the strategic plan in the 2011 - 2014 quadrennial and enhance the capacity to operate a financially sustainable operation beyond 2014.
- 2. Governance

Institute practical planning, budgeting and progress tracking structure with clear roles for board, staff and volunteers.

# 3. Skier Development

Structure a thlete development programs to implement the Cross Country Canada Long Term A thlete Development Model (LTAD) at the club level.

# 4. Coaching Development

 $Provide\ year\ around\ coaching\ and\ coaching\ development\ opportunities\ to\ support\ the\ skier\ development\ program.$ 

#### Facilities

Secure site tenure arrangements and provide, maintain and staff facilities (including trails) to support club goals for programs and general enjoyment of the membership.

#### 6. Event Hosting

Develop an event hosting plan to compliment club participation goals, to provide competition opportunities for developing athletes and to generate revenue.

#### 7. Officials Development

Develop and maintain skills in the community to support the event hosting plan.

#### 8. Legacies

Capitalize on volunteer efforts by leveraging the legacy of major events such as the 2015 Canada Winter Games to support club goals and objectives.

# **Operational Plan: Strategic Initiatives**

Strategic initiatives are prioritized activities that will be undertaken in 2010-2011 in addition to ongoing operations and status quo programs. These initiatives grow and/or enhance aspects of the club in support of the strategic plan.

- Initiative #1: Establish a governance committee and develop a documented governance model that is accepted
  by board for next planning cycle April 2011.
- Initiative #2: Establish a finance committee and structure club finances to enable grant applications by October 2010.
- Initiative #3: Develop a multi year revenue plan for the club and adopt an annual planning framework for
  operational planning for April 2011.
- Initiative #4: Implement a snow shoe rental program by December 2010.
- Initiative #5: Appoint a Director of Facilities and Develop conceptual trail and facilities expansion plans for CWG or similar events by August 2010.
- Initiative #6: Secure land for trail network expansion.
- Initiative #7: Appoint a Director of Athlete Development to guide head coach in development of a
  comprehensive plan to deliver a LTAD program at the club level.
- Initiative #8: Prior to the 2010 AGM develop an action plan to hire a head coach.
- Initiative #9: Focus the Track Attack program to engage Jackrabbit and Ski S'Kool participants in subsequent club programs.
- Initiative #10: Appoint a Director of Competitions and establish a competitions committee to plan and coordinate a minimum of three club and/or interclub events annually.





# **Facilities**

## **Advance Planning**

- Strategic plan in place before the games were announced
- Conceptual facilities plan in place before the 2015 Host Society was formed
- Homologated competitions courses were laid out on the ground and processes were in place to acquire additional land for the courses before the 2015 host society hired its first employee
- Shovel ready infrastructure project ready for provincial call for proposals
- \$521 K infrastructure grant for summer 2012 construction season
- Currently the only non municipal facility with committed funding
